NEIGHBORHOOD NEWS

Common Space Area (Tract H) Development:

There have been many ongoing projects for the Bauer Highlands HOA. The biggest recent project being the Phase I completion of the common space area located at the end of NW 125th Avenue in the NW corner of Bauer Highlands. The HOA could not develop the common space until the last home was built on that corner. After much consideration concerning cost and possible uses of the area, the HOA hired Cascadian Landscaping to level, grade, seed and irrigate the property to make it more useful in anticipation of future phases of development. The total cost for Phase I was \$50K which depleted the account we had been building for the past five years just for this project. Martin Sanders has recently been hired to maintain the grassy area in addition to the landscape work they currently perform for Bauer Highlands. We will be organizing a committee to plan for further development of that common area. Missing Fleur de Lys:

The HOA has been working on the solution of the missing Fleur de Lys plaque at the Bayonne entrance of Bauer Highlands. We are still trying to locate all the missing pieces; however, if we are unsuccessful in the retrieval of all 4 pieces, we will place an order for a new plaque with the original artist. The replacement of the plaque will cost the HOA \$600. We will make all efforts to ensure that the plaque is properly secured; however, should pieces of the plaque fall off in the future, please notify the Board at info@bauerhighlands.org as soon as possible so we can ensure a quicker recovery of the fallen pieces.

What is ARC?

Spring is here and summer is upon us! Homeowners are starting home improvement projects as the weather improves. As you start to plan your new projects, please make sure you get your applications in as soon as possible to the ARC.

Article 6.1 of the CC&Rs states: No improvement shall be commenced, erected, placed, or altered on any Lot until the construction plans and specifications showing the nature, shape, heights, materials, colors, and proposed location of the improvement have been submitted to and approved in writing by the Architec-

tural Review Committee (ARC). What this means is that as a homeowner, you are required to get approval from ARC any exterior changes to your home which includes landscaping changes as well. Exterior paint changes must also be approved by the ARC. The current approved paint palettes are available on our website. Depending on the complexity of the project and the number of applications received in any given period, the ARC is dedicated to making every effort to review and approve projects in a timely manner, taking into consideration homeowners' and contractors' proposed schedules. As the weather improves and the sun is out, there will inevitably be more outdoor activity. Homeowners are taking more walks and children are playing more out side as they enjoy the Oregon summer. Please SLOW DOWN in the neighborhood, especially if you see children playing outside. There have been many complaints of speeding in the neighborhood and as a Board, we have tried to find a solution to the problem. Washington County performed a speed assessment in the neighborhood in 2007 and did not feel speed bumps were warranted. Of course, there are many factors that could have impacted this study; however, as a result of the study, it is now out of the HOA's realm to consider adding speed bumps in the neighborhood as it is a decision that must be implemented by the county. The only thing we can do as an HOA is to get the word out and ask homeowners to SLOW DOWN!



Lawn and Yard Maintenance

Another thing to keep in mind during the spring and summer months is the need to keep lawns and yards maintained. As an HOA, we would like to keep the neighborhood beautiful in every way so not only homeowners, but visitors can see that we value our neighborhood. We will continue to enforce this rule so that we can maintain a beautiful community and increase the value of our homes. Community Association Partners, our property management company, performs periodical site visits and drive bys making note of homes who may be in violation of the up keep of their yards based on our CC&Rs. CA Partners then sends outletters to those homeowners regarding the matter. Please understand, this is the only way the HOA can ensure that all homeowners are in compliance of keeping our neighborhood nice. We hope you can appreciate our efforts in beautifying Bauer Highlands and protecting everyone's home values.

Cracked Ringer???

Is the button on your doorbell cracked or broken? If so, it may be a recalled door bell. There were several door bells at Globe Lighting, where homeowners chose their door bells during the design phase with Legend Homes, that were recalled as a result of faulty bulbs. These bulbs became too hot causing the front plate of the button to crack and break. The newer designs include an LED bulb which keeps the temperature much cooler so that the plates will not crack. Bring your old door bell back to Globe Lighting, and they will exchange it for a new one at no cost, unless you choose a more expensive door bell.

Getting Rid of Old Stuff?

We'd like to remind homeowners that it is against our CC&Rs to have any indoor furnishings out on the curb or in driveways unless the homeowner is having a garage sale. If you have free items you would like to give away, you need to dispose of them properly at the city dump, Goodwill, or any agency that will accept used furniture.

Neighborhood Watch!

This is a new topic we would like to discuss in future newsletters. The HOA would like to form a Bauer Highlands Watchdog Group and keep our neighbors and children safe and aware of what's going on in our neighborhood. Over the years, there have been several suspicious and criminal activities that include car break-ins, garage item thefts and UPS/FedEx package thefts. As a result, we would like to start the planning phase of organizing a neighborhood watch group and to also have homeowners report criminal or suspicious activities they witness to watchdog@bauerhighlands.org. All reports of suspicious and criminal activities will be emailed to homeowners as they occur and will also be published in the next newsletter, so that homeowners are better informed.
